

CONCERT BAND GUIDELINES

Classes are established by difficulty of music only **EXCEPT** Class B100A (Beginner Bands only). This class is **EXCLUSIVELY** for 1st year band students. All members of a band entering this class **MUST** be in their 1st year of instruction on the instrument they are performing. Beginner bands may enter B100A or any other class if they so wish.

For better adjudication/clinic, please ensure that the measures of the own choice selection are numbered.

The photocopying of Copyright music is illegal. Therefore, the Festival cannot allow the use of photocopied conductor scores. Any photocopied conductor scores will not be submitted to the adjudicators and will be destroyed. Please be aware that some publishers may take several months to send original scores, others don't provide any, but some may take only a short period of time. PLEASE NOTE THAT THE FESTIVAL PROVIDES ORIGINAL CONDUCTOR SCORES FOR ALL CONCERT BAND PIECES ON THE MUSIC SELECTION LIST.

The following equipment will be provided: 1 set timpani (23, 26, 29, 32), concert bass drum and stand, snare drum and stand, bells, xylophone, chimes, gong and Manhasset music stands, 1 bass amplifier.

The Festival **DOES NOT** provide any percussion accessories—this includes **CYMBALS OF ANY KIND.**

Due to the large number of entries and to allow adequate performance and workshop time, the Festival may be forced to limit the number of entries. **Therefore, registrants will be accepted based upon the date their paid entry is received. ALL ENTRIES MUST GO DIRECTLY TO:**

Each Director is required to pick one piece of music from the repertoire list (according to which class they are entered).

JAZZ BAND/COMBO GUIDELINES

The following equipment will be provide on the stage: complete sound system, acoustic piano, 4-piece drum set plus cymbals, bass amp, guitar amp, piano amp and music stands. For a better adjudication/clinic, please ensure that all measures are numbered.

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JAZZ BAND/COMBO CATEGORIES

Jazz Band - 12-24 performers Jazz Combo - 2-11 performers
Dixieland Combo - 2-11 performers

JAZZ BAND/COMBO CLASSES

- A101 - College or University Ensemble, no age restrictions - All members must be enrolled in the same College or University during the current academic year in course work in addition to the performance ensemble
- A102 - organized community rehearsal group - no age or affiliation restrictions
- A202 - organized community rehearsal group or multi school groups - maximum age of 20 years as of January 1 (current school year)
- A301 - single high school or multi high school group with a common conductor for both schools and in numbers in individual schools to create a full group, subject to confirmation by the Affiliated Festival Coordinator
 - maximum age of 17 years as of January 1 (current school year) or registered in Grade 12
 - all members must be full time students as defined by the local school board
- A302 - organized community rehearsal group or multi school groups ineligible for class A301
 - maximum age of 17 years as of January 1 (current school year)
- A401 - single high school or multi high school group with a common conductor for both schools and insufficient numbers in individual schools to create a full group, subject to confirmation by the Affiliated Festival Coordinator
 - maximum age of 16 years as of January 1 (current school year) or registered in Grade 11
 - all members must be full time students as defined by the local school board
- A402 - organized community rehearsal group or multi school groups ineligible for class A401
 - maximum age of 16 years as of January 1 (current school year)
- A501 - single high school or multi high school group with a common conductor for both schools and insufficient numbers in individual schools to create a full group, subject to confirmation by the Affiliated Festival Coordinator
 - maximum age of 15 years as of January 1 (current school year) or registered in Grade 10
 - all members must be full time students as defined by the local school board
- A502 - organized community rehearsal group or multi school groups ineligible for class A501
 - maximum age of 15 years as of January 1 (current school year)
- A601 - single school, multi high school or community groups
 - maximum age of 14 years as of January 1 (current school year) or registered in Grade 9
- A701 - single school, multi high school or community groups
 - maximum age of 13 years as of January 1 (current school year) or registered in Grade 8
